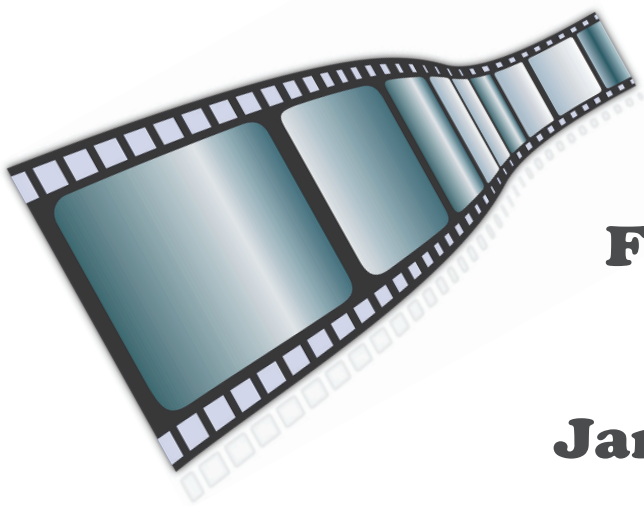


MOVIES THAT MATTER
